SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (B)

Sunday 28th July, 2024

2 Kings 4.42–44 Psalm 144 Ephesians 4.1–6 John 6.1–15

Elisha is in Gilgal during a famine in the land, and the sons of the prophets gather around him. Aware that the men are starving, Elisha asks that barley loaves and fresh grains be given to them to eat. But his servant replies, ‘How can I serve this to a hundred men?’ Elisha insists that the servant gives it to them, for the Lord says, ‘They will eat and have some left over.’ Indeed, they eat and, as the Lord has promised, there is more than enough for all of them. Praise the generosity of God, feeding his followers with physical food after he had fed them with the word of God. Like the prophet Elisha, Jesus knows the people are hungry. Jesus asks Philip where they could buy some bread for the people. Philip is pragmatic in his response, ‘Two hundred denarii would only buy enough to give them a small piece each.’

A denarius was a day’s wage. In other words, a hundred-day wage would not be enough to feed the number of people. Interestingly, Andrew notices a small boy with five barley loaves and two fish but knows it is insufficient for the crowd.

There seems to be some acknowledgement that Jesus could perform a miracle like Elisha. Jesus then takes the loaves, gives thanks, and shares them out. He does likewise with the fish. The people eat as much as they want, and there are leftovers, just as in the miracle of Elisha. Jesus asks that they pick up the leftover pieces so nothing is wasted.

The Tradition of Mass Intentions It is a longstanding Catholic tradition to have Masses offered for a particular intention, for the living and the dead. Mass Cards, signed by the priest, can be sent to comfort relatives, friends and loved ones. We do this because our Catholic faith is centred on Mass and the Eucharist, the source of our life in Christ. The tradition began in the early Church when the faithful would donate bread and wine for the Eucharist. In time donations of money were substituted which would support the clergy in their ministry. Thus the priest would accept a stipend for a specific intention. All Mass Intentions are voluntary offerings, since the Holy Eucharist is the universal prayer of all the church. The suggested amount to donate is usually £10 for each person. Mass Cards are available in the Repository shop in the church porch at St. Helen's. In both churches there are also little brown envelopes on which you can write the details of your own mass intention, if not sending a Mass Card, and then please drop into the offertory collection. Alternatively please email Ongar@brcdt.org or speak to Fr. Emile directly. Mass will be said at the earliest date available, but we will try to meet a requested date.
