## FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT (C)

### Sunday 1st December, 2024

**Jeremiah 33.14–16, Psalm 24.1 Thessalonians 3.12 – 4.2, Luke 21.25–28, 34–36**

Advent is a time of preparation, for Christmas and this year for the coming Jubilee, a time of expectant waiting. Are we getting ready for Christmas or attentive to the Second Coming. How will we celebrate the Saviour's birth this year, and each day how aware are we of Christ's presence in our ordinary lives. Our scriptures have laid foundations for Luke's clarion call for us to stay awake at all times for the coming of the Son of Man at the end time.

He will fulfil God's **promise in Jeremiah** by being a righteous branch of the House of Israel and Judah, executing justice and righteousness. These qualities will mark the last days, but the promise also means we must try to bring them about in our own day.

This will be achieved, **says Paul**, if our love for others increases and abounds, if we please God more and more.

Jesus calls us to respond now, to be prepared for any eventuality of future distress of nations. Our hearts need to be free of the pressures of sins of dissipation, drunkenness and the cares of this life. We need to pray to stay awake unless these pressures will overtake us.

Our goal is to stand blameless before the son of God. Are our preparations for Christmas help others see that the coming feast is more than just a happy holiday. It is a challenge to find the best ways of communicating the real meaning of Advent and Christmas this year.

Our collect asks God to give us the resolve to be ready to meet his Christ with righteous deeds at his coming. For today and for the future, when we **meet Jesus in Word** and Sacrament in **our celebration of the Eucharist**.

**ADVENT 2024** We begin this Advent with a new translation of the Scriptures in our liturgy. The Jerusalem Bible or the Revised Standard Version and the Grail Psalms have been our translation for decades. From today, we all move to the English Standard Version and the Abbey Psalms. Much will be familiar, but there will also be many differences of style and vocabulary. Those changes may strike us and so help us to think afresh the meaning of the sacred text. Let us pray that we will embrace this as the Word of God that is always alive and active.

**New Lectionary** From the first Sunday in Advent we will be moving over to the new mandatory Lectionary. Mass books won’t be able to be replaced at this time though more of the Mass cards may be made available if required. You may wish to purchase your own missal from the Catholic Truth Society website where they offer various versions of the New Sunday Missal 2025. Another option is the Day by Day books, kindly organised by Margaret Payne, which contain the readings and psalms for every day of each month. We do appreciate the generosity already shown in this parish by parishioners but replacing the Lectionaries for both churches has been very expensive and we would be very grateful for any donations towards the cost.
