FIRST SUNDAY IN LENT (C) Sunday 9th March, 2025

Deuteronomy 26.4-10 Psalm 91 Romans 10.8-13 Luke 4.1-13

In the Scriptures the desert is an ambiguous place. It is a zone of risk and promise, of betrayal and fidelity, emptiness and fullness, false nostalgia and hope. The desert is full of the tension of temptation where a choice must be made. Yet it is also a privileged space in which God encounters his people to show them who they really were, his own beloved. The little 'credo' in Deuteronomy testifies to this.

St Luke inserts the Lord's time in the desert between his baptism which confirms his divine identity and his preaching in the synagogue which outlines his mission. Full of the Holy Spirit, Jesus is led by the Spirit into the desert. Utterly clothed in God, divinely equipped for what he must go through, he is in this in-between place where he must truly confirm his divine sonship in preparation for his mission. This desert experience is not so much about cosmological struggle between the devil and the divine (the Holy Spirit makes sure of this) as of existential choice. Luke notes that the devil departs to return at the opportune time. This is when Satan would sift Peter and the others like wheat (22.31) and when he would enter Judas (22.3).

There is a contrast here: Judas denies his identity, but Peter would turn back and confirm his brothers. The Lord himself never encounters Satan again but knows that what he experienced would also be experienced by those who follow him.
