PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD (C) Sunday 13th April, 2025

Luke 19.28–40 Isaiah 50.4–7 Psalm 21(22).8–9,17–20,23–24 Philippians 2.6–11 Luke 22.14 – 23.56

When Jesus entered Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, the crowd believed that he was coming to their rescue, that he would act as the strike that would end Roman rule and give Israel its independence. In Luke's version the crowd are heard to cry 'Blessed be the King who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!' (Luke 19.20). This pronouncement of Jesus as King along with the use of palms, a symbol of Israel's quest for independence, were a declaration to the Roman authorities of violent rebellion.

But Jesus did not intend it to be as such. Rather by riding a donkey into Jerusalem, he indicated his desire to be the Lamb of God, a symbol of peace and nonviolence, something that we must aspire to be. Catholic social teaching tells us that, like Jesus, we must wage peace on behalf of all peoples, not just those of our own nations or ethnic group. 'Peace is not merely the absence of war; nor can it be reduced solely to the maintenance of a balance of power between enemies; nor is it brought about by dictatorship. Instead, it is rightly and appropriately called an enterprise of justice'. But to pursue peace and justice we must become counter cultural, adopting a humble approach (Luke 22), seeking honest dialogue with those whom we disagree.

These readings provide a sharp reminder that the Christian path is often one of derision and humiliation. How we react is up to us. We can react with violence in word and deed, or we can follow the path set out for us by Jesus when he healed the soldier's ear serving others humbly as the symbol of a nonviolent kingdom.
