## A gentle reminder on receiving Holy Communion

From time to time, it is helpful to recall the Church's guidance on how Holy Communion is received, so that we can approach the Eucharist with reverence and unity.

At some Masses, Holy Communion may be offered under both kinds. The Church provides different ways for this to take place, one of which is called intinction—when the Host is dipped into the chalice.

However, this is carried out according to the Church's liturgical norms. For this reason, self-intinction—when a communicant dips the Host into the chalice—is not permitted.

The Church's guidance expresses this clearly:

“If Communion from the chalice is carried out by intinction... the priest takes a host, dips it partly into the chalice and... the communicant receives the Sacrament in the mouth from the priest.”

(General Instruction of the Roman Missal, no. 287)

“The communicant must not be permitted to intinct the host himself in the chalice...”

(Redemptionis Sacramentum, no. 104)

It is also important to remember that Christ is fully present—Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity—under each species of the Eucharist. This means that receiving the Host alone is a complete Holy Communion.

As the Church teaches:

“Communion under the species of bread alone makes it possible to receive all the fruit of Eucharistic grace.”

(General Instruction of the Roman Missal, no. 281)

While receiving under both kinds is a fuller sign, it is not necessary in order to receive the whole Christ.

This gentle reminder is offered to help us all receive Holy Communion in a way that reflects the Church's teaching, and to deepen our shared reverence for the great gift of the Eucharist.
